Bruce Davidson presents our Referral Rewards Program area.

The foundation and its members create events and programs that engage communities of all ages and backgrounds. One of the foundation's goals is to "strive to build public and private initiatives that provide opportunities to enrich lifelong learning throughout our community."



The foundation was established in 1990 when a group of library patrons gathered with the mission to further the library's success within their given communities. With this support system, the district has expanded to cover 4,200 square miles and multiple counties with its headquarters in Vancouver. Some of the programs it supports include the Summer Learning program, early literacy initiatives, author events and the Reach Out and Read Program at the Vancouver Clinic. These programs and events are specifically designed to promote reading from an early age to adulthood. For example, the Grow a Reader program places bins filled with books and reading tips in waiting rooms and facilities that serve highneeds populations. The hope is that patients and visitors will read while they wait for appointments and become inspired to continue to read and learn. By promoting literacy, reading and learning through programs such as these, the foundation strengthens communities.
